Scripture Focus: Joshua 24:14-18; Philippians 3:10-14

[Joshua said to the people] "So fear the Lord and serve him wholeheartedly. Put away forever the idols your ancestors worshiped when they lived beyond the Euphrates River and in Egypt. Serve the Lord alone."

The people replied, "We would never abandon the Lord and serve other gods. For the Lord our God is the one who rescued us and our ancestors from slavery in the land of Egypt. He performed mighty miracles before our very eyes. So we, too, will serve the Lord, for he alone is our God."
